The Halls Were Alive with the Sound of Music Peggy Trendell-Jensen

Many thanks to all who came out to enjoy an evening of melodic merriment, and provided food and drink, at the recent Sound of Music Sing-a-Long.

Nearly 100 people (including various nuns, Marias and Georgs) gathered to watch the classic movie, which is 50 years old this year. Along with a meal break for European wieners, sauerkraut and struedel, there were trivia questions, waltz lessons and door prizes (including freshly delivered pretzels from Munich!)

Most important, however, was a (very!) long paper rendition of the Alps stuck to the wall, with a laminated von Trapp family attempting to cross from Austria to Switzerland. With each \$100 that was raised over the course of the evening for our soon-to-be sponsored North Van Region refugees, the von Trapps were able to scale another mountain peak. By the time the credits were rolling at movie's end, they had made it across the border – and we had raised over \$2,100 for the cause!

The identity of one of our refugees has been confirmed – Ali, a 24year-old blind man from Somalia. We are awaiting details about the family group we will be sponsoring, and look forward to sharing the news with you soon.

Christmas Postage Stamps – A Recycling Opportunity Lois Macgregor

As the Christmas mail starts arriving, please keep in mind that the interesting array of Canadian and international stamps on the envelopes and packages have value for the Canadian Bible Society. The stamps are sold to collectors and the money received is used for the publication and distribution of bibles.

When cutting the stamps from envelopes and packages, please leave at least 1/4 inch of paper around the stamps. Your envelopes and bags of used stamps may be left in the box in the bottom drawer of the small wooden cabinet outside of the church office. The stamps are collected and delivered to the Bible Society on a regular basis. This is a recycling project that continues throughout the year. Thank you. Your participation is appreciated.

Refugee Program – Heather Peacock

The Deanery of North Vancouver along with the parishes of Gloria Dei and Mt. Olivet Lutheran have banded together to sponsor three refugee families. St. Catherine's, St. Clements, St Agnes and Gloria Dei have formed a committee which has met with interested parishioners to short list the refugee families. The available families change every few days so it has been a challenge choosing families but we have settled on one, a blind young man from Somalia who has been in a refugee camp for some time and whose medical certificate runs out at the end of November. The group felt he deserved a chance for a new life and his sponsorship had been approved. We await his arrival date. The two other families are being worked on daily.

St. Catherine's hosted the Sound of Music sing-along which raised over \$2000.00 for the refugee fund. There will also be a big band concert at the church which will support the refugee fund. All of the parishes will pool their refugee funds to help raise the approximately \$70,000 that will be needed to sponsor the refugees. If you would like to help, you can send your donation to the church marked "Refugee Fund". Thank you to all who contribute.

Turning Point Recovery Society - Brenda Stenson

Turning Point Recovery Society is one of BC's leading residential support recovery service providers and we are fortunate to have one of their Recovery Houses in the District of North Vancouver. In the fall of 2014, the Turning Point, North Shore Women's House was opened at the foot of Lloyd Avenue, two blocks away from Gloria Dei Lutheran Church.

The program is typically 3-5 months in duration and is open to adults aged 19 and older who are wanting help. The North Shore House can accommodate nine women.

The days are quite structured for the women with yoga, nutrition, budgeting and counseling sessions as well as several twelve step meetings each week. They do not leave the house until they have a place to live and money to support themselves, and there is always follow up to ensure they are doing well.

Gloria Dei and St. Catherine's have partnered to support this Recovery Home for Women by providing Welcome Baskets to new residents on their arrival. Parishioners donate new items including a journal, note cards, crossword/Sudoku book, soap, lotion, lip balm, mug, water bottle, individual hot chocolate and coffee, tea bags, gum, Kleenex. These personal items are arranged in the basket and the basket is wrapped in cellophane and tied with ribbon. A tag is attached that lets the women know we are supporting them.

Members of St. Catherine's and Gloria Dei have generously and enthusiastically donated money and/or the items for these Welcome Baskets six times. We have been able to deliver ten baskets each time. This is a total of sixty (60) Welcome Baskets.

Here is a bit of feedback from a former resident:

"I received my basket and was completely overwhelmed that someone would do this for me"

Thank you to the amazing, generous people of St. Catherine's and Gloria Dei. You have definitely made a difference for 60 women.

Coffee & Conversation



News from The Preschool

September came alive with little voices in all three classrooms, the gym, outdoors, the music room and the hallways. Our Rainbow Room teachers welcomed our Discovery 2's. This year we have twelve children Monday and Wednesday and sixteen children Tuesday and Thursday. Our 3's are excited to be in the Treehouse Room. Twenty attend Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings and twenty attend Tuesday and Thursday mornings. We also have twenty children who attend our extended program 9:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. three days per week. We also run an afternoon program for 3's and 4's and they can attend up to five afternoons if they wish to.

This year we have welcomed a new music teacher, Rachel Buttress. She is delightful and brings music to life with her guitar, creativity and beautiful singing voice. The children are very excited when it is their turn to go to music class. Our Christmas Preschool Services will be on December 9 and 10 in the evenings.

Last year it was suggested that we offer Sunday School for preschoolers during the 10 a.m. service. Any young children attending the service with families are welcome. Drop off is in the Rainbow Room at 9:45 a.m. One of our teachers, Gabriella Pasek, and her daughter Rebecca offer short stories, songs, crafts and a light snack. "Charlie the Church Mouse" loves to visit with the children.

Several of our preschoolers have attended our Messy Church evenings. It is usually the last Thursday of each month from 5:00 to 6:30 p.m. We begin with a welcoming song and a group circle. An Arts & Crafts activity is planned followed by a story and a sit down meal with friends. Great family fun!

In October, St Catherine's Church welcomed children from our pre-school, their families, young members of our own church family to our first Messy Church since the summer break.

Messy Church is a form of church for children and adults that involve creativity, celebration and hospitality. We meet on the 4th Thursday of each month from 5.00 until 6.30 pm to sing songs, have fun with messy crafts, scripture based story and dinner. Each month we have a new theme and in November we are celebrating Lighting up the world and Advent.

In December, the Messy Church sheep trail will be part of a community project with the local businesses in Edgemont Village, culminating in the family Nativity Service on Christmas eve. The aim is for a wonderful **Knit-i-vity! where knitted sheep can bring Jesus baaaaa...ck into our local stores!**

We will not hold a session in December but will meet again on January 28th 2016.
