Give us this day the bread we need, give it to those who have none.

Let forgiveness flow like a river between us, from each one to each one.

Lead us to holy innocence beyond the evil of our days — come swiftly Mother, Father come.

For yours is the power and the glory and the mercy: forever your name is All in One. Amen
