## **AFFIRMATION OF FAITH**

*As we celebrate Trinity Sunday we are invited to affirm our faith in God using words adapted from the Athanasian Creed.*

We worship one God in Trinity, and Trinity in Unity,  
neither confounding the Persons, nor dividing the Substance.

**For there is one Person of the Father,**

**another of the Son,**

**and another of the Holy Spirit.**

**But the Godhead of the Father, of the Son,**

**and of the Holy Spirit, is all one,**

**the Glory equal, the Majesty co-eternal.**

Such as the Father is, such is the Son,  
and such is the Holy Spirit.

**So the Father is God, the Son is God,**

**and the Holy Spirit is God.**

**And yet they are not three Gods: but one God.**

**So likewise the Father is Lord, the Son Lord:**

**and the Holy Spirit Lord.**

**And yet not three Lords: but one Lord.**

**The Father is made of none:**

**neither created, nor begotten.**

**The Son is of the Father alone:**

**not made, nor created, but begotten.**

**The Holy Spirit is of the Father and of the Son:**

**neither made, nor created, nor begotten,**

**but proceeding.**

**And in this Trinity none is before, or after other:  
none is greater, or less than another;  
But the whole three Persons are co-eternal together:  
and co-equal.  
So that in all things, the Unity in Trinity,  
and the Trinity in Unity is to be worshipped.**

On the night before he died for us, our Saviour Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his friends, and said: "Take, eat: This is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them and said: "Drink this, all of you: This is my blood of the new covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me."

In obedience to his word,  
**We remember his death on the cross.  
We proclaim the resurrection to new life.  
We await Christ's coming in glory.**

Remembering now the suffering and death,  
and proclaiming the resurrection and ascension  
of Jesus our Redeemer,  
we bring before you these gifts.  
Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for us  
the Body and Blood of Christ.

As we eat and share these holy gifts,  
renew us by your Spirit,  
inspire us with your love  
and unite us in the body of your Son  
Jesus Christ our Lord.

*All*                    **Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, to you be honour, glory, and praise, for ever and ever. Amen.**
