GOSPEL READING: LUKE 2:1-14

Presider The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ,

according to Luke.

In those days a decree went out from the Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth and laid him in a manger, because there was no place in the inn.

Now in that same region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid, for see, I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favours!"

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH: THE NICENE CREED

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Marv and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate: he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Breathe your Spirit, O God, upon this water that all your servants who are washed and anointed with it may share with your Christ in his death and resurrection. Let there be no distinction among those whom one font, one Spirit, one faith make one people.

All May we become a sign and foretaste of your Kingdom, a diverse people, open to the light.

We give you praise and honour and worship through your Child, Jesus the Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.

PREPARING THE TABLE: THE FIRST NOWELL (CP 139)

Presider

We give thanks to you, Lord our God, for the goodness and love you have made known to us in creation; in calling Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus your Son.
